Spring 2017 Parks and Islands Improvements

In the Park:

- Shrubs were hard pruned \Diamond
- \diamond The beds around the trees and shrubs were weeded and mulch was replaced
- \Diamond 5 pines were removed due to disease
- \Diamond New trees are being purchased and will be planted this Spring
- \Diamond Suggestion for a Legacy Tree to be planted each year
- \diamond Suggestion for signs to identify trees and shrubs

In the Detention Basin:

- Work to dredge and replace stones was scheduled for the outlet \Diamond
- \Diamond Work to clean the inlet is planned, erosion to be mitigated
- \Diamond Plans for new trees, plants and rocks was proposed and approved

On the Islands:

- \Diamond The islands were assessed for beauty and need for improvement
- \Diamond Appleby Court's island was deemed in most need and a plan has been approved
- The plan includes an Autumn Brilliance Serviceberry Tree surrounded by Taxis Yews with Feather \Diamond Reed Grass toward the front and space at the very front for smaller perennials.
- \diamond Suggestion for a Landscape designer to propose plans for the other islands as time and budget allows.

At the Entrance:

- Spring clean-up, weeding, bush trimming and mulching is scheduled \Diamond
- \Diamond Additional perennials possible, trenching around beds is planned.
